## Do you know your alphabet? Do you have a good memory?

Four letters have been lost.

It's up to you to put them back in the right place in the alphabet!

### Goals

To read, memorise and locate letters on an alphabet baseplate.  
To understand the spatial organisation of a page.



### The adult prepares

- 1 alphabet baseplate
- a set of letter bricks, from A to Z in a bowl

### The children play

**1** **Player 1** takes four letters from the bowl, and gives them to **player 2** for one minute.

**Player 2** takes the four letters, remembers as many as possible and return the bricks to **player 1**.

**2** **Player 2** takes the remembered letters from the alphabet baseplate and moves them to the bottom.

Both players compare and discuss the letters to see how many were correctly remembered.

### Facilitation tips

- Start with fewer alphabet bricks, for example A to J.
- Change the number of letters to be remembered.
- Allow more or less time to read and to find the correct letters.
